Q2 What was the name of the space probe that, along with the Huygens lander, orbited Saturn between 2004 and 2017? It is named after the Italian scientist and astronomer noted for his detailed observations of Saturn's rings in the late 17th century.	Cassini
Q3 Which moon of Saturn, the planet's seventh-largest moon, is often said to resemble the Death Star from <i>Star Wars</i> because of the unusually large crater visible on one side?	Mimas
Q4 Rounded to the nearest whole number, how many Earth years does it take Saturn to orbit the Sun? We'll allow a margin of 2 Earth years either way.	29 (accept 27 to 31 inclusive)
